As regent of the Peter Horry Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, I had access to early minutes. The Chapter was organized in 1926. Annual fundraisers included Colonial Teas and plays. In addition to supporting national and state DAR projects, the chapter addressed the needs of the community by giving money to Conway Hospital to support tonsil clinics and in 1928-1929 planted 58 trees between Stonewall Filling Station and town, alternating water oaks and crepe myrtles.

March 8, 1929, in Conway's High School Auditorium, Peter Horry Chapter D. A. R. sponsored a play "Rose Time," a three-act musical comedy, directed by Mary Holdridge. Mrs. J. A. Sasser played the piano.

Cast members were Carl L. Busbee, John E. Watson, Mary Wall, Essie Elliott, Joe H. Grissette, Rembert Busbee, C. B. Seaborn, John Dukes, Mrs. John Dukes, Virginia Hutchinson, Elizabeth Livingston, Delie Blocker, Mary Frances Garrison, and Mrs. Herriett. Chorus Members were Eugenia Buck, Elizabeth Benson, Sarah Owen, Mary Orpah Ward, Allison Allen, Eva Mae Dunn, Aileene Elliott, Bessie Stalvey, Mary Catherine Winstead, Catherine McCoy, Lella Taylor, Gertrude Davis, Hannah Rose Smith, Loraine Evans, Emma J. Bryan, and Anna Marion Busbee.

Luckily, someone included a play program along with the DAR minutes, so that we have a glimpse of an earlier life in Conway.
